## To Whom It May Concern

A Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) is required under the U.S. OSHA Hazard Communication Standard for all hazardous materials. Most developed countries have similar regulations and requirements. The MSDS is a detailed informational document prepared by the manufacturer or importer of a hazardous chemical. It describes the physical and chemical properties of the product. MSDS's contain useful information such as flash point, toxicity, procedures for spills and leaks, and storage guidelines. Information included in a Material Safety Data Sheet aids in the selection of safe products, helps you understand the potential health and physical hazards of a chemical and describes how to respond effectively to exposure situations.

The requirements for MSDS's are found in the U. S. Federal Register, paragraph (g) of 29 CFR 1910.1200. MSDS's must be developed for hazardous chemicals used in the workplace, and must list the hazardous chemicals that are found in a product in quantities of 1% or greater, or 0.1% or greater if the chemical is a carcinogen.

Under OSHA standards, a MSDS exists for Lasalocid, one of the products used in the formulation of Calf Pro<sup>®</sup>. However, **since the concentration of lasalocid in Calf Pro is 0.5% and is below the 1 percent of a chemical that is deemed hazardous;** the Calf Pro formulation is not required to have an MSDS. Lasalocid (Bovatec<sup>®</sup>) also is not classified as a carcinogen.
